

Rev. Charles K. Schutt was born again to Eternal Life, arriving in the Kingdom, meeting his Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ for the first time. He left this earthly life in the wee hours of the morning, on Wednesday, May 21, 2014. There to greet him at his Homecoming, were his parents and sister.

Rev. Schutt, age 75, a resident of Clinton Township, Michigan was born August 8, 1938 in Detroit, Michigan to the late Roy H. Schutt and Anna L. LaBuhn Schutt.

Growing up in Detroit, he attended Denby High School, graduating in 1956. He proudly served in the United State Army in the Railway Transportation Corp which would offer him a lifelong passion for trains. After his honorable discharge, he entered Concordia Seminary in Springfield, Illinois and earned his Bachelor of Divinity in 1964. His first parish was Zion Lutheran Church at Downs Hunter, Kansas for three years. He accepted a call to St. John Lutheran Church in Rochester, Michigan from 1967 until 1969. From 1969 until 1970 he served with Peace Lutheran Church in Sandusky, Michigan. For the next twenty seven years he would serve St. Luke Lutheran Church in Clinton Township, where he retired from the ministry in 1997. In his spare time and after his retirement, he thoroughly enjoyed his model trains and up until his passing, had some of his tracks and trains in his home in excellent working order.

He is survived by a niece and nephews. Besides his parents, he was preceded in death by a sister Irene Hawk.
